

Irune Aguirrezabal Quijera, PhD, is an international professional with an extensive career on development, policy and programming at the UN, in government positions or leading a human rights campaign for a global CSO. She has worked as advisor or director, in Europe, West and Central Africa and Latin America.

Throughout her work, she has focused on public goods, linked to the sustainable development agenda: democracy-governance, gender equality/women's rights, migration, international criminal justice, human rights, prevention of terrorism. She has stood out for her ability to conceptualize proposals to solve global challenges from interdisciplinary approaches, building broad alliances and seeking synergies.”

She holds a Law degree with various postgraduate studies on international relations, EU-political science, studies on economics and public policies (LSE, Harvard, ESADE) and a PhD in multidisciplinary gender studies.
